Unemployment

How do you help?

- 3 Training days for basic small business skills. (22,29 June & 6 July)
- You provide used clothing in a good condition. The first bag is given to an unemployed woman to sell. Enough cash is made to buy the next bag, with enough income to buy food, & so on. The gospel is shared with these families. This is an empowering process bringing hope.
- Foodstuffs like beans, split peas etc are used in the same way.
- Your financial gifts employ trained staff who continue the mentoring process when small businesses have been started and they also supervise savings and credit groups as a means of instilling discipline in household income management. The staff also help with guidance on the establishment of deep trench gardens which are efficient in the use and conservation of water



Mrs K's encounter with Jesus

Mrs K has an income of R 400 / month, from one child grant. She has an 8yr old son and another in matric. She has been depressed and even

suicidal at her inability to provide for her children, especially the matriculant, who is bright and wants to do well so he can get a job and support his family. Khuthala (Hope Trust caregiver) brought Mrs K to our attention. After prayer we were led to provide them with a weekly food parcel from food you donated. Mrs K was asked to fetch the food from Daphney's house where she would also receive counselling. After 2 food collections she received Jesus Christ into her heart. Since, she has found 2 part-time jobs, and God keeps providing! Jesus rescued her spiritually and materially, in accordance with the Hope Trust vision to Rescue, Restore & Empower.

Providing the salaries of staff who supervise the following:

- Soccer and netball among young primary school age children
- Obtaining of Birth certificates, Identity documents, and making application for social grants.
- Feeding of child headed homes
- Reading groups that meet regularly for Bible stories and ensuring that youngsters receive an impartation of the gospel/ good news of Jesus.

The next Holiday club is scheduled for 27 June for children & teens' to have fun, food & fellowship, to receive mentoring and the impartation of Christian values.
